As we continue to grow, we offered 2 full weeks of aviation academies for elementary, middle and high school. We also offered SpACE Academy for the first time and were encouraged by the students' comments at the conclusion of the week. A total of 51 students participated this year, 9 elementary, 23 middle and 19 high school students. Thanks to the generosity of many contributors, we were able to provide \$5100 to 21 students so they could participate in the week's activities. When asked to comment on the statement, "We got our money's worth from ACE Academy," two parents agreed and added, "It is worth any amount of money to have a 14 year old talk about his day! The car rides and dinners were filled with detailed conversations!" and, "The experiences in which Timmy was able to take part not only opened his eyes to the many facets of the world of aviation, but

ACE Academy Planning for 2016

Student and parent comments help to drive the improvements to our ACE Academy offerings each year. The Instructor Team meets at the end of each day to discuss how to make the next day better. Additionally, we meet at the end of ACE to discuss changes that need to be made for future years. Frequent comments request more flight time. We also find it difficult to provide the career speakers and presenters who interest all students. Not all student have the same interests and they all wish there could have been more (or less!) information about a particular career. These are the two areas we hope to work on for ACE 2016.

More Flight Time

This is very difficult due to the cost involved, however, we are seeking ways to increase flight time for high school students who have attended our ACE Academy three or more times. We are also considering flights on rotary wing as well as fixed wing aircraft.

Career Themes

When students register for ACE, they will select a group which will concentrate on a particular career theme. Each group of students will concentrate on 2-3 career fields in a given week. All students will still receive a flight experience, but their exposure to additional career fields will be determined by the group in which they have registered. We will soon contact ACE 2015 participants to see which career fields are of most interest. Suggested Career Fields include: Pilot, Airlines and Airport Operations, Aircraft Systems Maintenance, Law-related Services, Health Services, Airline and Airport Services, Aircraft Manufacturing Occupations, and Science and Technical Services.


Materials Donation

ACE Academy includes a session on planning and navigation and Mr. McGonagle's materials will allow students to see how planning was done prior to iPads and Tablets. More importantly, they will know what to do when the batteries in their Pads and Tablets run down!

Teacher Professional Development Workshops

Six different session are planned that will cover the 6 **Civil Air Patrol** (CAP) Modules; Introduction to Flight, Aircraft Systems and Airports, Air Environment, Rockets, Space Environment and Spacecraft. Two additional sessions have been added, a Teacher Orientation Program (TOP) Flight and

an Aerospace Excellence session. Teachers attending these sessions will receive a one year CAP Aerospace Education Member (AEM) membership and an opportunity to apply for CAP grants. NH CAP Aerospace Education Officers are invited to participate as well.

In every workshop, teachers "do" the activities just like their students will. They also discover granting organizations to help them plan and implement the activities with their students. These include: CAP AEX, STEM Kits, and classroom grants from CAP, Air Force Association, American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics and the National Association of Rocketry. All sessions are held at the Laconia Airport in Gilford NH. Check-In starts at 8:30, adjournment at 3:30.

There is a \$75 registration fee for non Civil Air Patrol members and \$40 registration fee for CAP AEMs and Senior Members. Registration includes all workshop materials, lunch, snacks, & CAP AEM membership. The following sessions are scheduled:

PSU Grad Credit Opportunity for Workshop Participants

Girl Scouts: WinnAero has once again partnered with the **Girl Scouts** to offer an aviation experience for girls in the NH & VT area. Scouts will participate in hands-on activities that demonstrate the forces of flight and how planes stay in the air. They will be introduced to the parts of an aircraft (engines and flight surfaces) airport markings, management and operations. Finally, girls will be provided with an opportunity to fly a plane with an Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) flight instructor through the Young Eagles program. The first opportunity is on Saturday, October 17, from 8:30 – 4, while the second opportunity is on Saturday, April 2, from 8:30 – 4.
